Summer 2020 MUN Institute English Fluency Screening Process

We're excited to host your students at the Model United Nations Institute. One of our core values is "Bring out the best in others". Because of this, we want to make sure we can bring out the best in your students by ensuring that they are in the right program to learn as much as possible at the MUN Institute! To figure out which program your students are best suited for, all students must take an English Level Test to assess their level in English. Here is our process for each of your students to take the test.

Instructions

- 1. Have your students go to this link: www.londonschool.com/online-english-level-test/ and fill out their information. They should answer "No" for the last two questions on this page.
- 2. Then, they should proceed to answer as many of the questions on this test as they can. There are 60 questions total, and the exam should take 10-30 minutes for each student. They can take as much time as they want to select the correct answers for each question. After each section, they should press "next"- after question #60, pressing "next" will submit their responses.
- 3. Once students submit their test, they will receive an email with their English Level results.
- Students should then forward this email to their group organizer and to englishexchange@bestdelegate.com with the subject line as follows: MUNI English Test 2020 (Group Name) (Student Name)
- The group organizer should share a spreadsheet with the title MUNI English Text 2020 (Group Name) that includes each students first name, last name, email address, date of birth, and level.

Levels

Your students will receive results based on a scale of 1-9, with 1 being "beginner" and 9 being "very advanced". Each of their scores will correspond to a level on the table on this page: www.londonschool.com/level-scale/.

To actively participate in our English Exchange Program, students must be at least at a "Pre-Intermediate" (Level 3) English Level, but for best results we recommend they are at a "Low-Intermediate" (Level 4) English Level.

To actively participate in our Diplomat Program, students must be at an "Intermediate" (Level 5) English Level, but for best results we recommend they are at an "Upper Intermediate" (Level 6) or higher English level.
